Learn: Examining hospital operations that include dose processes, drug studies, and drug dispensing systems. **What**

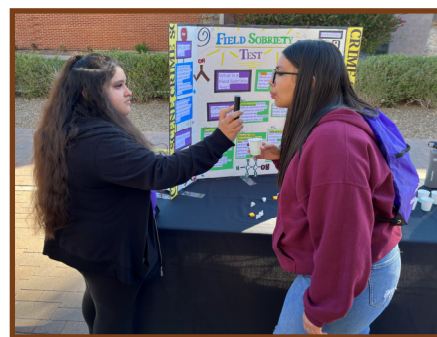
We Do: Mixing sterile drugs, calculating dose volume, drawing up solution in syringe, and injecting liquid in I.V. bag at correct size and content.
