
CAVIT honored 80 students with NTHS membership during the September 21 Ceremony held at CAC Signal Peak Pence Center.



## Students Research Future Careers

All first-year students participated in CAVIT's Career Display project designed to provide students with information on the numerous careers that exist within their program. Students worked in teams of 2-3 to research everything about their chosen career and created a visual display to highlight information. Students practiced a 5-7 minute presentation that was shared with classroom peers. Teachers scored students on their research, display board, and classroom presentation. Staff agreed that this year's work was outstanding!

A schoolwide gallery walk was conducted for students to learn career pathway options from the 270 display boards presented.



## CAVIT Receives High Scores

Each CAVIT program underwent ADE (Arizona Department of Education) monitoring reviews. CAVIT submitted documentation to meet compliance in the following categories:

- Curriculum, facilities, work-based learning, business partnerships, assessments, career development, and HOSA/SkillsUSA integration.

CAVIT earned a 97% average quality score that earned each program a Distinguished Achievement rating.



The monitoring included a site visit from ADE staff who visited each program to validate teacher documentation.

Teachers were awarded with a banner to hang in their classrooms recognizing ADE achievement.

## Construction Project Begins

Existing classroom space is being renovated for Welding and Construction programming for next year. The repurposed space will address the county's employment demands in both career fields. The renovation project is set for completion in May.



## Students Begin Path to College

Activity conducted at the start of this school year included students registering for dual enrollment college credit coursework through Central Arizona College. Eligible students approved for dual enrollment have a jumpstart in their post-secondary plans after high school graduation. Special thanks to CAC for being a supportive partner with CAVIT.
